Selecting appropriate assessments and creating graphic representations of student progress over time can enhance student success, can improve collaboration and communication among teachers and other school personnel and between teachers and families, and can guide decisions regarding the effectiveness of instruction. The session will guide teachers and/or school personnel in the progress monitoring process.

Learning Outcomes:

- Discuss methods for monitoring progress over time in reading and mathematics
- Create graphic representations of progress to enhance communication and collaboration, to guide instruction, and to support student self-regulation skills
- Practice interpreting assessments across reading and mathematics and evaluating student response-to-intervention (RTI)

Games will include activities with sounds, syllable types, sight words, vocabulary and comprehension. Participants will have time to try out a variety of games and will have many ideas and templates to take back and try out with their students.
